



**AN ACT TO AMEND §§2101 AND 2101.1 OF CHAPTER 2
OF TITLE 5, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE
TO THE JURISDICTION OF THE GUAM STATE
CLEARINGHOUSE.**

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1.** §2101 of Chapter 2 of Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby
3 *amended* to read as follows:

4 “§ 2101. **Creation of the Guam State Clearinghouse.** There is
5 within the Office of *I Segundu Na Maga’lahi* [Lieutenant Governor] a

1 bureau of the government of Guam which *shall* be known as the *Guam State*
2 *Clearinghouse*.

3 Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, the Guam
4 State Clearinghouse *shall* have exclusive purview at the Guam level over all
5 Federal aid programs, grants, loans, contracts, contributions, appropriations,
6 advances, direct Federal development and other Federal funding sources for
7 the government of Guam. The Guam State Clearinghouse *shall* be headed
8 by a Director, who *shall* be *I Segundu Na Maga'lahi* [the Lieutenant
9 Governor], who *shall* determine the positions and staffing pattern of the
10 Guam State Clearinghouse.”

11 **Section 2.** §2101.1 of Chapter 2 of Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, is
12 hereby *amended* to read as follows:

13 **“§ 2101.1. Duties and Responsibilities of the Guam State**
14 **Clearinghouse.** In addition to the duties and responsibilities of the Guam
15 State Clearinghouse as may be prescribed by *I Segundu Na Maga'lahi* [the
16 Lieutenant Governor], or by law, the Guam State Clearinghouse *shall* also
17 have the following duties and responsibilities:

18 (a) Administer the initiation, coordination and review
19 process of all governmental activities within the government of Guam
20 involving Federal financial assistance.

21 (b) Ensure that government grant proposals for Federal
22 assistance are in accordance with plans, policies, programs, objectives
23 and procedures of the government of Guam.

24 (c) Ensure that proposed government projects for which
25 Federal financial assistance is sought are fiscally and environmentally
26 sound and are in compliance with all applicable Federal laws.

1 (d) Ensure that the government of Guam complies with all
2 applicable Federal laws relating to Federal financial assistance and
3 that there exists sound tracking, management, and financial
4 accountability for all Federal programs awarded to the government of
5 Guam.

6 (e) Perform cost analysis on all Federal aid programs,
7 grants, loans, contracts, contributions, advances, direct Federal
8 development *or* other Federal funding for the financial impact on the
9 government of Guam's General Fund *or* special funds used to fund
10 the local matching requirement as prescribed by Federal law; and the
11 financial impact on the government of Guam of continuing the
12 Federal program by the government of Guam *if* the Federal funding
13 expires. Said analysis *shall* describe the indirect costs the grantee
14 government agency is eligible for, the amounts applied for and
15 received from each grant, the previous year's funding level and
16 funding estimate for future years. Said analyses *shall* be performed as
17 an integral part of the state clearinghouse process and submitted to
18 the Speaker of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*, the Chairperson of the Special
19 Accounting Service, the Chairperson of the Special Economic
20 Service, and the Director of the Bureau of Budget and Management
21 Research within fifteen (15) days after completion. The cost analyses
22 required hereby *shall* be included in *I Maga'lahi's* Executive Budget
23 request pursuant to Title 5 GCA §4107(b).

24 (f) With the exception of the Guam Community College and
25 the University of Guam, and notwithstanding any other provision of
26 law to the contrary, no application for any Federal aid programs,

1 grants, loans, contracts, contributions, advances, direct Federal
2 development, or other Federal funding shall be submitted or deemed
3 approved on behalf of the government of Guam or any agency,
4 division, office, department or instrumentality thereof, or any public
5 corporation, without the final approval of the Director of the Guam
6 State Clearinghouse.”

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Appropriations, Taxation, Public Debt, Banking, Insurance, Retirement, and Land convened a public hearing on November 17, 2011 at 9:00 am in *I Liheslatura's* public hearing room.

II. COMMITTEE PROCEEDINGS

(a) Bill Sponsor Summary

Chairman Pangelinan. Good morning, Ladies and Gentlemen. Welcome to the public hearing by the Committee on Appropriations, Taxation, Public Debt, Banking, Insurance, Retirement and Land. We will begin to receive testimony on Bill No. 340, “An Act to Amend §§2101 and 2101.1 and to Add a New §2106 to Chapter 2 of Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated Relative to the Jurisdiction of the Guam State Clearinghouse.

Before I call those individuals who have signed up to testify, I want to recognize and thank my colleagues that are here this morning; to my far left is Senator Aline Yamashita. To my immediate left is Senator Adolpho Palacios. Thank you for your presence this morning.

We have signed up to testify on Bill No. 340 is Mr. Eric Palacios. Mr. Palacios, please come forward and take the witness table. Please identify yourself for the record and we will begin receiving testimony.

Very quickly, Bill No. 340 is a bill introduced by Sen. Respicio who is not here; he is off-island at the moment. We wanted to accommodate this referral and hold the hearing on this bill. He has assured us that it would be fine to hold the hearing without his presence.

A very simple amendment to the law is the subject of the bill. The amended language would limit the duty of the State Clearinghouse seeking federal grants for the government of Guam. Other amended language would be for non-profit organizations that may also be affected.

At this time, we will go ahead and receive the testimony.

(b) Oral Testimonies

(1) Mr. Eric Palacios. Thank you and Good Morning Honorable Pangelinan and Good Morning Senators Palacios and Yamashita.

My name is Eric Palacios and I am the Administrator of the Guam State Clearinghouse. I would like to thank you for giving me this opportunity to speak on this bill.

The intent of the bill, as I understand it is in line with the belief that I have and that is, allowing private businesses, NGOs and NPOs like private businesses to operate with minimum oversight or involvement by the government, except where of course lawfully practical. To that end, there are some points of interest that I would like to address regarding the bill in its present form.

The first one is: if this bill were to pass by this good body and eventually become law, it wouldn't drastically change the current setup, according to current Guam law, although NGOs would not be subject to the Guam State Clearinghouse' review process. Whenever NGOs or

NPOs partner or propose to partner with the government agency or entity, it will be subjected to the Guam State Clearinghouse' review process by virtue of having that public entity in the fray. Many federal funding opportunities recommend this type of public-private partnership and some actually require it. That's why I say that not a whole lot would really change if this were to become law.

The other point that I would like make is that I believe that if passed into law, it would unnecessarily create a divide and competition between local, public and private entities - NGOs and NPOs – that they would both be going after the same pot of federal funding from different angles where rather than partnering, they would be going against each other. One of the things that we have tried to nurture at the Guam State Clearinghouse is this partnership between the public and private entities and it has proven beneficial a few times this year.

In addition to the dwindling federal funding that is available through grants, the landscape is becoming more and more competitive. I think that by subjecting NGOs, NPOs and public entities to this type of competition, it will only hurt Guam in the long run.

The other point that I would like to make is I believe there should be some type of repository in the government for all federal grants with data and information to include grants applied for, awarded, denied and the reasons why they were denied. I believe that this information is important for future grant applications. It could also be used as a good measuring tool in that we could track the areas where we receive federal funding and we can actually pinpoint areas where we can say we need a little more in this industry or we need more in that industry. So, having that sort of repository set up would be beneficial on different levels.

Chairman Pangelinan. Thank you very much and *Si Yu'os Ma'ase*. Before we proceed with any questions from the panel, I would like to also thank and welcome Senator Tony Ada who has joined us and to my right is Senator Judi Guthertz.

Senator Palacios, did you have any questions or comments?

Senator Adolpho Palacios. Thank you. I think allowing the non-profit organization to directly apply – the advantage there is that it might shorten the time because there is an alternate route by which an organization can apply. As it is right now, it is my understanding that sometimes it is choking because there is only one outlet. To my knowledge, there is at least one organization that has been waiting for clearance from the Guam State Clearinghouse and I wouldn't be surprised if this event is what made this necessary that Clearing House can sit all year, if they want to sit all year looking at things.

But, the non-profit organization has to go forward. To me, the bottom line is I don't think this would hurt at all. Mr. Chairman, I don't agree that this would be a disadvantage to allow a direct application by a non-profit organization. That's my comment and I guess the Clearinghouse, because it is an agency of the government of Guam that it should make it their business to clear grant applications by government agencies and allow the non-profit organization not to be subjected to the waiting list and the convenience of the Clearinghouse. Thank you, Mr. Chairman.

Chairman Pangelinan. Thank you very much, Senator Palacios. Senator Yamashita?

Senator Aline Yamashita. Thank you very much, Speaker Ben. Thank you Mr. Palacios for being here and spending some time with us.

So, essentially I hear you say that you disagree with the bill.

Mr. Eric Palacios. In its present form, yes.

Senator Aline Yamashita. I am also going to focus on page 3, (f). In my work before I took this particular position, before the people put me here, a lot of my work dealt with grants. I was part of the University of Guam CEDDARS and they are very successful at grants. I was there for five years. For me, I don't think anyone should be exempted from this and this is the reason: we have limited resources and the last huge project that I was engaged in was identifying all of the projects and grants that supported early childhood education. Your predecessor was trying really hard to identify all of that. We were trying see the intersections and understand how we were really wasting money because different pockets were trying to do the same thing, but people weren't speaking with each other. I saw that the Clearinghouse as really the avenue.

I certainly understand what Senator Palacios was saying about waiting and waiting some more. But for me, that is an issue of efficiency at your level and your team about using the technology about having drop dates and ensuring that people are doing what they are supposed to be doing by when they are supposed to be doing it. Guam State Clearinghouse really should be a place where you have a handle on all of the resources coming into our island, of all the available resources - about who is competing for what, who is applying for what. It's a huge picture. It's the horizon of what's going where and how. I think that's really important. It was really difficult to get the needed information.

It was hard for people to understand where all of this was going and even though our island is only 30 miles, 4 miles wide it's incredible to me how people don't talk to each other. But we are all trying to do the same thing. I am very interested in hearing further conversation about this particular bill. There's got to be a clear reason why we have four Senators sponsoring it and I am open to that. I do appreciate what you are saying. I think it is important that we have a very good handle on everything that is occurring on our island and who's trying to do what. I think that information will strengthen everyone trying to do what it is they are trying to do.

I think you (referring to Eric Palacios) would be the person to know what that information base looks like and to help those of us trying to - I could say to you that this is what we are trying to do and you can say, well these are the folks that are already trying to do that and then I would hook up with them and say, can we collaborate?

Speaker Ben, thank you very much for the opportunity.

Chairman Pangelinan. Thank you very much Senator Yamashita. Senator Guthertz?

Senator Judith Guthertz. Yes, thank you. I have a little different take than Senator Yamashita on this matter.

First, although information giving is very important and I think there should be a mandate that information from all government instrumentalities regarding federal applications and all non-profit entities regarding federal applications for grants and so forth should be provided to the Guam State Clearinghouse.

However, I strongly believe that both the Community College and the University should have the freedom to pursue grants without permission from your office or any executive branch office. Otherwise, I strongly believe they would encounter problems from their accreditors regarding their autonomy. This could impact their accreditation. So, as far as information giving, they should be mandated to provide information on what they have applied for, what they have received – just normal information giving to the State Clearinghouse, but should not be subject to authorizations and permissions or approvals from the State Clearinghouse for their federal grant applications and their management of those federal grants.

I just want to state that for the record because I believe it would have a direct impact on the autonomy and the accreditation status of the University and the Community College. I say that having experience as the Academic Vice President at the University of Guam. The accreditors were very vocal about having the University being subjected to executive branch approvals with reference to their expenditure of funds, their federal grant activities and similar financial transactions. We need to be very careful.

Thank you.

Chairman Pangelinan. Thank you very much, Senator Guthertz. I want to thank Senator Taijeron for joining us this morning.

Thank you very much Mr. Palacios. I believe Mr. Tydingco wanted to testify.

(2) Mr. Phil Tydingco. Thank you and good morning Senators. My name is Phil Tydingco, Chief Deputy representing the Office of the Attorney General.

The only thing I wanted to point out and I think you folks were already talking about it. I want to assume that perhaps this bill may be sent to mark up or a round table to try and understand the intent for the amendments. Also it has never been clear in my head and our offices – on page 3, subsection (f) – what is it all about?

I think we all agree that having a central clearing house is conceptually a good thing, but I don't know that we all necessarily do it. Many agencies are single state agencies and they handle their grants. For example, the Department of Education may be the single state clearing house, Mental Health may be the single state clearing house for substance abuse grants, AG office is the single state clearing house for the VOCA. All these may not involve the State Clearinghouse.

That's the only input I wanted to provide. It would be really helpful if we understood what subsection (f) means. I just wanted to put on the record that we would welcome opportunity to sit down and discuss what does this mean in application.

Senator Judith Guthertz. Does the State Clearinghouse charge an administrative overhead fee for the grants that it looks at?

Mr. Eric Palacios. We do not.

Senator Judith Guthertz. You do not. You don't charge any fees to any departments or agencies?

Mr. Eric Palacios. No, we do not.

Senator Judith Guthertz. And the current bill would not allow for that or provide for that in any way?

Chairman Pangelinan. No.

Senator Judith Guthertz. Ok, Thank you.

Chairman Pangelinan. *Si Yu'os Ma'ase.* Thank you very much for your testimony, Mr. Tydingco and Mr. Palacios.

This concludes the testimony on Bill No. 340. There being no additional individuals to present any additional testimony, this Committee will continue to remain open for the acceptance of any additional information or public testimony on the bill discussed. 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



3 by the government of Guam *if* the Federal funding expires. Said
4 analysis *shall* describe the indirect costs the grantee government
5 agency is eligible for, the amounts applied for and received from each
6 grant, the previous year's funding level and funding estimate for
7 future years. Said analyses *shall* be performed as an integral part of
8 the state clearinghouse process and submitted to the Speaker of *I*
9 *Liheslaturan Guåhan*, the Chairperson of the Special Accounting
10 Service, the Chairperson of the Special Economic Service and the
11 Director of the Bureau of Budget and Management Research within
12 fifteen (15) days after completion. The cost analyses required hereby
13 *shall* be included in *I Maga'lahi's* Executive Budget request pursuant
14 to Title 5 GCA §4107(b).

15 (f) With the exception of non-profit organizations, the Guam
16 Community College and the University of Guam, and notwithstanding
17 any other provision of law to the contrary, no application for any
18 Federal aid programs, grants, loans, contracts, contributions,
19 advances, direct Federal development, or other Federal funding shall
20 be submitted or deemed approved on behalf of the government of
21 Guam or any agency, division, office, department or instrumentality
22 thereof, or any public corporation, without the final approval of the
23 Director of the Guam State Clearinghouse.”
